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Buffalo to Host NACUFS Northeast Regional Conference

University at Buffalo welcomes over 100 universities; Jim Kelly - keynote speaker

BUFFALO, N.Y. – Western New York will welcome culinary professionals from across the Northeast and Canada when Campus Dining and Shops (CDS) and the University at Buffalo (UB) host the National Association of College and University Food Services' (NACUFS) 2016 Northeast Regional Conference. The winning chef of the regional competition earns a spot to compete at the 2016 National Culinary Challenge July 14, 2016 in Anaheim, California.

"Our conference goal is to promote high-quality food service by providing members with exceptional educational programming and numerous professional networking opportunities."
